COVID-19 Protocols

Welcome to Camp at the Hands On Children's Museum! We look forward to providing your child with an engaging, fun and safe learning experience. Our team is making modifications to our building, exhibits, and practices to follow and exceed local, state, and CDC camp guidelines. In addition, we are also incorporating the best practices in our field.

Safe Entry Procedures Include:

- Daily health screenings and temperature checks for everyone entering the building, including staff
- Increased hand washing throughout the camp day, plus easy access to hand washing stations, hand sanitizer, and wipes throughout the museum and the Outdoor Discovery Center
- Face coverings are required for staff, Museum visitors and campers
- Social distancing of 6 feet required between groups. Reminder decals are located throughout the Museum including at project stations, tables, and exhibits

Camp Procedures Include:

- ASAP (As Safe as Possible) curriculum introduced on the first day of camp
- Small camp cohorts (that allow 6ft distancing in the classrooms and during activities)
- Each camper will be assigned cubby/storage space for the duration of the week
- Each camper will receive personal material kits, offering one-user only supplies for experiences throughout the day
- Camp cohorts will not mix during teaching or activity time
- Generous use of the Outdoor Discovery Area
- Campers will have time to explore Museum exhibits. This time will be separated from the general public through scheduling or physical boundary markers.
- Increased cleaning of classrooms and facility throughout the day
