Welcome to Summer Camp at the Hands On Children's Museum! We look forward to providing your child with an engaging, fun and safe learning experience. Our team is making modifications to our building, exhibits, and practices to follow and exceed local, state, and CDC camp guidelines. In addition, we are also incorporating the best practices in our field.

Some of our updates include:

- Small camp group sizes (8 campers)
- Each camper will be assigned cubby/storage space for the duration of the week
- Camp groups will not mix
- Social distancing floor decals at project stations, tables, and exhibits
- Increased use of our Outdoor Discovery Area
- Personal material kits for each camper, offering one-user only supplies for experiences throughout the day
- ASAP (As Safe as Possible) curriculum introduced on the first day of camps
- Increased cleaning of classrooms and facility
- Increased hand washing throughout the camp day, plus easy access to hand washing stations, hand sanitizer, and wipes throughout the museum
- Daily health screenings for everyone entering the building, including staff
- All staff will wear face coverings; face coverings encouraged for campers (see Thurston County Health Department for more information)
- Campers will have some time to explore Museum exhibits separate from the general public. This time will also be separated by camp groups
